

Aim:

To build the capacity of citizens to engage in planning and running services and portfolios of projects that respond to their communities' needs and advance community benefit.

- **Empowered citizens** on Anglesey **influence policy and decisions about services** through a robust framework of decision influencing forums, events and community based activities.
 - **Strong and equal partnerships between public bodies and Anglesey Citizens**, focused on meaningful action planning, are the basis of **revised strategic planning frameworks**.
 - An enhanced culture of **citizen participation** and involvement exists across Anglesey.
 - **Anglesey citizens report improved services**, supported and reported through sustainable community voice representative structures.



Cynefin – ‘Habitat’ ‘Place’

The Cynefin change programme aims to develop new joint working and co-productive approaches.

Cynefin will make the connections between communities and service delivery partners to promote environmental equality and social justice across Wales

- 
- Enabling local people to identify and negotiate their shared priorities and draw down the support they need from government and other agencies;
 - Helping policy makers and delivery agents to hear, understand and respond more precisely to the needs of local people and places in which they live. Plans will be tied in with local Single Integrated Plans;
 - Achieving better outcomes for places where there is poverty - building on people's sense of pride in place and environment.



Involving citizens in the design and delivery of services is important no matter which political or economic reality there is.

Involving services users:

- **Empowers individuals** as active agents rather than passive recipients of services
- Acknowledges the person as an **active agent** in determining their wellbeing
- **Strengthens local democracy** and trust through involvement and genuine feedback on their input to service design
- **Raises** their **awareness** of delivery issues, (including budgets realities).
